



**Public Workshop Summary Notes
Held in Trinity Center on October 17, 2011
State Route 3 Transportation Concept Report**

Passing / Pull-Outs / Turn Lanes:

- There are a lot of places along the route from Weaverville to Trinity Center that could be used for a pull out if they were paved, currently most are just gravel. These areas would need to be signed as well.
- Passing lanes are needed in both northbound and southbound directions from Rush Creek Road to Trinity Center.
- There is no left turn pocket into the dump in Weaverville. Signage in advance of the dump would also be good.
- Scott Mountain needs pull-outs.

Maintenance:

- The highway is very well maintained and the crews do an excellent job of snow removal during storms.
- Sometimes there doesn't seem to be anyone plowing between the hours of 4:00 -7:30 AM from Trinity Center to Weaverville.
- It would be helpful if there was some consistency in the tree trimming maintenance along the lake area. The USFS has done this in the past but it no longer gets done. From the top of Slate Mountain the trees are so overgrown you can no longer see Mt. Shasta like before.

System Information:

- When a construction project is happening, signs are being placed very far in advance and it is confusing to travelers.
- The current sign for the Scott Mountain closure is confusing and doesn't really tell if the road is open or not.
- Internet traveler information is not always kept up to date for the Scott Mountain closure.

Bike and Pedestrian Related:

- It would nice to have bike lanes from Coffee Creek to Convington Mill.
- A bike and pedestrian crossing across Swift Creek would be nice to accommodate kids going to school and the influx of tourists in the summer months who visit and camp at the KAO and other places along Trinity Lake.

Other:

- An attendee asked if Caltrans would allow fiber optic along SR 3 and if there are any plans for it.
- There was some discussion about centerline reflectors and the how decisions are made to place them.
- An attendee said she has used the online maintenance reporting system to express her thoughts and no one ever responded to her.
- It would be nice to have Community Gateway Monuments for Convington Mill, Coffee Creek and Trinity Center that all shared the same theme.
